Military/Veteran Leadership Award

Description:

This award recognizes a military connected student (an active service member, reserve, National Guard or a veteran) who has made significant contribution to the support of the college success and transition for student veterans.

Eligibility:

1. Student must be enrolled as a student at the University of Illinois Springfield.
2. Awarded to an undergraduate or graduate student.
3. Student must be a military connected student.
4. Student must be in good academic and conduct standing.
5. Requires a letter of nomination from a UIS faculty or staff member.

Guidelines:

- The award recipient must agree to have their name and photograph publicized.

Selection Criteria:

- The selection committee will be using the following criteria to make their selection:

Campus Engagement	Takes the initiative to participate and support the educational, cultural and social development of the campus community through programs and activities throughout the division in an effort to enhance the quality of the student experience.
Leadership	Demonstrates leadership through formal or informal role on campus by motivating, persuading, and developing common purpose among others that promotes change while also engaging in skill development to improve oneself and their peers.
Connection	Engages in opportunities to develop the awareness and support throughout campus for military connected students. Supports opportunities for military connected students to connect with one another while supporting the integration of military connected students into the campus at large.
