OPT is a privilege provided by the U.S. government to international students who desire to gain employment experience in their major field of study.

The workshop is designed to better prepare prospective beneficiaries about the application processes which includes, among other essentials details, an understanding the eligibility criteria, reporting requirements, key dates. OPT applications are administered and authorized by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS).

Soccer, and sports in general, have been a huge support in my life. I believe staying active is essential for both physical and mental health. It gives me a chance to disconnect from my thoughts and fully immerse myself in something I love for a few hours

each day. It's incredible that after 17 years, I'm still playing soccer and enjoying it just as much as I did in my first year. It's also amazing how fortunate I am to be able to play the sport on

an entirely different continent. I'm truly grateful for this experience.
