Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is a Virtual Career Fair?

A: A career fair that is held entirely online via a virtual platform. For our upcoming fair we will be using the <u>Handshake platform</u> which allows students to sign up for brief virtual 1:1 or group conversations with employers that are of interest. Participants need to be able to access the internet and be able to participate in online meetings so having access to a web camera and microphone are important. Virtual fairs allow for both student and employer participants to join from anywhere and have professional networking conversations.

Q: What is Career Suite?

A: Career Suite Drop-in and Zoom-in hours allow student to connect with Career Development Center staff in an informal in-person or virtual setting.

During Career Suite hours, students can:

- Get help writing a resume or cover letter
- Have your current resume, cover letter, or personal statement critiqued
- Learn how to navigate CareerConnect (Handshake) and other online resources
- Find out about helpful career building resources and tools & much more!
